Brands like Wiley X offer virtually shatterproof lense and frames – an essential aspect for anglers who are likely to give them a tough time.

STYLE
Style is almost as important a function with sunglasses. All anglers want to look good, so make sure you only stock the 'sexy' models.

ACCESSIBILITY

Make sure you can cater for wearers of normal spectacles, whether that be with 'fitover' style glasses or prescription options.
